Preparing for Lent

March 5th - April 16th

Lent is a beautiful season the Church has given us to help prepare our souls to celebrate the most important event in the history of the world: the passion, death, and resurrection of our Savior, Jesus Christ. The first day of Lent is always Ash Wednesday, in which we use ashes on our forehead in the shape of a cross to remember our own mortality and begin our journey of penance.

Each year, **Lent is an opportunity to renew our Christian faith**, and we are encouraged to use prayer, fasting, and almsgiving (the Three Pillars of Lent) as the means to grow in our relationship with God.


Prayer: If you don't have a daily prayer habit, Lent is the perfect time to begin. If you do, you can add a devotion or practice that will enhance your Lenten preparations

Fasting: The Church only requires that we abstain from meat every Friday in Lent and on Ash Wednesday, and that we fast on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday, eating only one full meal plus snacks that only add up to another meal. But fasting can be much broader than that. It may look like giving up things like gossip, your favorite coffee order, or forgoing music in the car and replacing it with prayer. The goal of "offering something up for Lent" is to turn our minds to God. So if you offer up listening to music while driving, try replacing it with prayers or with a Catholic podcast. Fast from social media, especially if you find you're on it too much, and spend that time in prayer or talking to a friend.

Almsgiving: Almsgiving reminds us of Jesus's call to serve and connects us in solidarity with our brothers and sisters in need. It traditionally refers to helping the poor financially, but by extension, we can help anyone in need by our actions, as well.

In contrast to Advent, **Lent is a solemn season** when the sacrament of reconciliation—where we ask God for forgiveness—becomes more of a focus. It's a time when Catholics discover how to confess—and the power of God's forgiveness.

Prepare
for Lent



The Stations of the Cross, taking place on Fridays during Lent, allow us to pray and reflect upon Jesus's final hours.

More **solemn songs** replace celebratory hymns during Mass.

Prepare your home - Think about what will help you and your family focus on Lent and put something in your home that will remind you every day: a purple table cloth; a display with a crown of thorns; holy water by your door.

There is no better time to reconnect with or deepen one's faith than Lent. During this time, we can draw closer to God as we prepare for the joyous celebration of Christ's resurrection at Easter.

Gospel Reflection Luke 6:39-45

In ancient Greece actors wore masks which concealed the face. One may say they were 'two-faced'. They were called 'Hypocrites', and we derive our word and the idea of 'hypocrite' from that. As did Jesus.



He could always see through the veneer which people (such as you and I) present to the outside world, and his gaze would (and still can) penetrate through to the heart – the core of the personality.

For us, judging the heart of someone is fraught with risk. As Jesus humorously put it, how readily we see the smallest splinter of sawdust in someone else's eye, and in super-critical mode fail to see the plank of wood which impairs and distorts our vision. We should not rush to judgment.

The fact is that only the gaze of God can really penetrate to the heart of someone. We know that the gaze of Jesus, Who is God, is always a loving gaze visualizing a heart open to salvation. (Mk 10:17-22)

Listen to the dying moments of Our Lord. His loving gaze penetrated beyond the masks and actions of his tormentors and focused on their hearts. Then he cried out this plea: 'Father, forgive them for they know not what they do.'

We are all conscious of the times we have fallen short of the practice and teaching of our Master despite our praying: 'Forgive us our trespasses as we forgive those who trespass against us.' We could pause for a moment to pray that The Teacher's loving gaze fall upon us to make us whole-hearted disciples willing 'to be formed by divine teaching'.

Jubilee 2025



2025 is the Jubilee Holy Year, the 2,025th anniversary of the Incarnation of our Lord, an "event of great spiritual, ecclesial, and social significance in the life of the Church." The concept of "Jubilee" has its origins in the Book of Leviticus (chapter 25) as a special year of reconciliation, pilgrimage, and coming home.

Pope Francis has designated the 2025 Holy Year as a time to renew ourselves as "Pilgrims of Hope."

What is Reconciliation All About?

A Jubilee year is a sign of reconciliation because it establishes a "favorable time" (cf. 2 Corinthians 6:2) for conversion. We are called to put God at the center of our lives, growing toward Him and acknowledging His primacy. Even the Biblical call for the restoration of social justice and respect for the earth stems from a theological reality: if God is the creator of the universe, He must be given priority over every reality and partisan interest. It is God who makes this year holy by bestowing on us His own holiness.

Not only does it [reconciliation] free us from our sins but it also challenges us to have the same kind of compassion and forgiveness for those who sin against us. We are liberated to be forgivers. We obtain new insight into the words of the Prayer of St. Francis: "It is in pardoning that we are pardoned."

Jesus entrusted the ministry of reconciliation to the Church. The Sacrament of Penance is God's gift to us so that any sin committed after Baptism can be forgiven. In confession we have the opportunity to repent and recover the grace of friendship with God. It is a holy moment in which we place ourselves in his presence and honestly acknowledge our sins, especially mortal sins. With absolution, we are reconciled to God and the Church. The Sacrament helps us stay close to the truth that we cannot live without God. "In him we live and move and have our being" (Acts 17:28).



Purple Lenten Cloth

March 8th & 9th

As we leave Mass on Saturday March 8th and Sunday March 9th, each of us will receive a square of purple cloth to carry with us during Lent.

It will remind us of Jesus' suffering and how we should honor Him with our love, prayers and sacrifice during Lent. Our Lenten Cloths will be given out at the doors of the Church.

Purple is traditionally the color of royalty. The soldiers placed a purple robe and a crown of thorns on Jesus' head to mock His kingship. They did not know that they were mocking no earthly king but the King of heaven and earth. And Jesus bore all of this with humility and divine mercy toward His tormentors.

In order to remember and honor Jesus' divine Kingship and all He endured for us, the color Purple is used throughout our liturgies and our church during the Lenten Season.



Spiritual Adoption Program March 22nd and 23rd

Everyone loves the beauty and innocence of a baby. As an expression of that love, we will begin a Spiritual Adoption Program on March 22nd and 23rd.

WHAT IS A SPIRITUAL ADOPTION?

We are asked to pledge to pray daily for a baby that is conceived this month that will not make it to birth. We name the child for whom we will be praying, thereby giving the baby the humanity he or she deserves. At the end of the term, on Dec 6th-7th gifts will be accepted for the baby and donated to Life Centers of Long Island.

WHY DO WE SPIRITUALLY ADOPT BABIES?

Not all babies make it to birth. In fact, more than 4,000 babies lose their lives to abortion each day. These are the babies we are being asked to “adopt” by pledging to pray for him or her each day.

WHO CAN SPIRITALLY ADOPT?

Babies can be “adopted” individually or by a family simply by signing up during the Spiritual Adoption Weekend.

Throughout the nine months of pregnancy there will be updates on our baby’s development and reminders to keep them in our prayers.

The power of prayer is great – consider spiritually adopting an unborn baby and share the love for life that God has given us.
