Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Words can not express the depth of my heartfelt gratitude for so many of you who have prayed for me and my family during the passing of my Father two weeks ago. Thank you once again for all the Mass and sympathy cards. A special thank you to those who were able to come to the wake and funeral of my Father or watch it live-stream. When I came to Our Lady of Lourdes 2 ½ years ago, you *(parishioners and staff)* welcomed me and my family with open arms. Thank you and it is a joy to be journeying with you.

When I became Pastor of Curé of Ars Church in Merrick 18 years ago, both my parents were also welcomed by the parishioners with open arms. They became involved in the parish for the next 12 years and made many friends. Before my Dad died, he expressed one day that he would love to have his funeral at Cure of Ars Church. The present Pastor of Cure of Ars, Msgr. Frank Caldwell, not only said we could have the funeral Mass there when the time comes, but he offered to wake my parents in the church as well. When I told my dad what Msgr. Caldwell was willing to do for them, he became very emotional saying, "Curé were some of the best years of their life. I would love to be waked in the church." Due to the dementia of my mother, she would not be able to understand any of this but, she too, would be happy at the gift offered by Monsignor.

I was so grateful that the organist of our Parish of Our Lady of Lourdes, Mike, was able to play for the funeral and Heidi, one of our Cantors, came to sing. Thank you so much. It was so great to have you there. I also thank our Pastor, Msgr. Brian McNamara, who has been so supportive of me continuing to help with the care of my parents. I will be forever grateful for this.

In our second reading from St. Paul to the Colossians, he says: "I rejoice in my sufferings for your sake and in my flesh I am filling up what is lacking in the afflictions of Christ on behalf of His body, which is the Church......." One may ask themselves, what could possibly be lacking in the suffering or afflictions of Christ? What is lacking is this: Me offering my suffering, my afflictions with Jesus to the Father for the salvation of souls. This is called Redemptive Suffering. Jesus invites us to join Him in His redemptive act of saving souls. St. John Vianney, the Curé of Ars said: "Suffering not offered up to God is wasted suffering."

The past few years my parents have been basically homebound. As I reflect on my Dad's life, I remember him saying to me last year that he felt that he was living too long and didn't know why God still had him here. What was his purpose?, he said. It was months later that my Dad said to me, "Charles, I realized that just being alive, I am living my purpose. Loving others, living and offering up my suffering and pains to the Lord for the salvation of others is my purpose." Jesus offered His suffering to the Father with love and not resentment or bitterness. He accepted it and His offering opened the gates of paradise for us and washed away sin. Heaven is now a possibility for us. Yes, all of us are invited to unite our life's pains, sufferings, disappointments, frustrations, etc. to Jesus as we offer it with Him to the Father for the conversion and salvation of souls. We can assist souls to accept what Jesus has done for them and turn away from their sins so Jesus can save them. When my Dad was in the hospital three weeks ago and in a lot of pain, I reminded him about uniting his pain to Jesus on the cross for the salvation of souls and he said to me, "I am." We do this as St. Paul says in the second reading today, "....on behalf of His body, which is the Church...." I was deeply moved by my Dad's faith and love for Christ and the Church. Christ's sufferings is waiting for us to unite our suffering with His. It takes a free act of the will. May we do this with love for Christ and one another.

Have a great week walking with your Lord. Remember, with God you can do the unthinkable, unimaginable and forgive what you think is unforgiveable.

All Volunteers - VIRTUS TRAINING






