Dear Parishioners:

As you may recall, at Fatima, the Blessed Mother told the world to "pray the rosary" for the conversion of Russia. At one point Stalin took over some of the Baltic states in the late 1940's. He was informed that the Pope was upset and concerned about the religious freedom of the people once Stalin took over. Stalin responded, "How many divisions does the Pope have?" For Stalin, since the Pope had no army, the Pope had "no divisions", so Stalin would triumph. Well, it took a long time – 72 years – but the Berlin Wall did fall. The Pope's divisions were you and me: simple, regular people praying the Rosary.

In that mindset, I urge everyone to continue to pray for a greater respect for human life. I'm sure that it has been hard to believe that Roe v. Wade would ever be overturned. But, on a federal level, it has been! On the Feast of the Sacred Heart and the traditional day for the solemnity of the birth of John the Baptist, the prayers of so many for the past 50 years were resoundingly answered!

However, we have not yet won the war and there will be many battles ahead, especially in New York. Also, our prayer is to protect all human life, from conception to natural death. Thus, we need to pray not only for the unborn, but we also need to pray for a greater respect for the elderly, frail, sick and terminally ill. We need to provide a Catholic response to our culture of death, such as physician-assisted suicide, euthanasia, human trafficking, etc.

I also wanted to give everyone a "heads up" on some projects here in the Parish in the future. We need to re-do the parking lots. They are beginning to look like Sunrise Highway before it was recently repaved, though hopefully no one is going 50 miles per hour in the parking lot! Hopefully, it will take place after the feast. Also, we need to look at the boiler in the school. The boiler in the school is 60 years old and it is even getting difficult to get parts. This, however, is a big project and will take some time – and it will be a big ticket item financially. I will let you know more about that when I know more!

Fr. Charles will be away on vacation in August so you will be seeing Fr. Anthony at various times. His fulltime job is at Our Lady of Consolation, but he will be able to help us when he is not at Our Lady of Consolation.

Remember: Together, we can do something beautiful for God.


