Dear Parishioners:

I wanted to highlight an issue that is becoming more and more of a problem is our society. That problem is the issue of pornography. I do not think that it is a stretch to say that "modesty" appears to be an outdated ideal; the Catholic ideal of sexuality and the place of sexuality in God's plan is regularly mocked on T.V. and the like.

Pornography reduces the human person to an object for one's selfish pleasure. This is in direct opposition to the beauty of the whole human person that God created in His image and likeness. People are never to be lusted after but to be loved as a whole person: *body, mind and soul*. Pornography leads the soul into sin. God says, "My saving power will rise on you like the sun and bring healing like the sun's rays." Malachi 4:2.

However, today, pornography is just as popular as baseball! Pornography is easily accessible on our computers, our smartphones, cable T.V., etc. Many people have found themselves suffering with an addiction to pornography. But help is available! Do not despair!

Overcome pornography and other unhealthy sexual behaviors with a professional, science-based Catholic program. Visit <u>www.ReclaimsexualHealth.com</u>. There is a Private and Anonymous Online Help 24\7. In 1 Corinthians 10:13 it says, "No trial has come to you but what is human, God is faithful and will not let you be tried beyond your strength; but with the trial He will also provide a way out, so that you may be able to bear it." Pornography can be an addiction. Pornography enslaves the soul and the deep shame that is connected to it. However, healing and recovery is possible. If you or someone you know has a porn addiction, please log onto the website above.

Also, visit the website: <u>www.IntegrityRestored.com</u>. This site also is designed for those who struggle with pornography use and those who may know of someone who struggles. Here you will learn about the pornography epidemic in America and how porn affects men, women, children and teens. You will learn about the addictiveness of pornography and the recovery process. Wives will learn how to help their husbands as well as how to find healing for their own emotional pain *(feelings of hurt, betrayal, etc)*. The website takes a unique approach by incorporating Catholic spirituality into the recovery process.

I also worry about our teen-aged children especially. Research has shown that the pre-frontal cortex of the brain controls judgement/common sense/impulse control and emotions. This crucial pre-cortex is not fully mature until a person reaches the age of 20-22 years. Therefore, the introduction of pornography to people younger that their early twenties can be devastating to this development. We need to protect our children from the terrible effects of pornography as well.

We do not have to be over-zealous Puritans, but we should not be naïve about the deleterious effects of pornography on adults and on children. Be vigilant especially of what your teens are watching on all types of media.

Remember: Together, we can do something beautiful for God.






