Our Mission

As stewards of all that God has given us, the Parish Family of Our Lady of Lourdes serves and ministers to all those who come to this place.

Regardless of a person's history, ethnicity, gender, orientation, age or race, we commit ourselves to open wide the doors of our Parish to provide a place of welcome and hospitality.

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Today we celebrate the Feast of Corpus Christi, the Body and Blood of Jesus Christ. This feast fulfills Jesus' promise when He said, "I will be with you every day until the end of time." He did not leave us orphans. Jesus comes to us, His body, blood, soul and divinity at each Mass in Holy Communion. Why? To make us like him. As Blessed Carlo Acutis said: "To become like Jesus I need to receive more of Jesus." Through Holy Communion Jesus comes to unite us to himself, to love us, heal us, help us, and strengthen us not only in our personal lives but to witness to others. He wants to give us what we cannot give ourselves.

The scriptures remind us how blessed we are to partake of the one loaf and the one cup. How blessed we are as Catholics to be able to be fed by Christ Himself at each Holy Mass. In 1931 Jesus appeared to Sr. Faustina Kowalska in Cracow, Poland, and said the following about Holy Communion. "I desire to unite Myself with human souls… When I come to a human heart in Holy Communion, My hands are full of all kinds of graces, which I want to give to the soul. But souls do not even pay any attention to Me; they leave Me to Myself and busy themselves with other things. Oh, how sad I am that souls do not recognize Love!" (Paragraph #1385 in Sr. Faustina's diary). "Oh how painful it is to Me that souls so seldom unite themselves to Me in Holy Communion. I wait for souls, and they are indifferent toward me. I love them tenderly and sincerely, and they distrust Me. I want to lavish My graces on them, and they do not want to accept them. They treat Me as a dead object, whereas My Heart is full of love and mercy" (Paragraph #1447). Therefore, let us receive Holy Communion today with profound gratitude and praise.

How are we to receive Holy Communion? Spiritually prepared and with humble hearts. When you receive, please remember to nod your head first out of reverence and love and then consume the Sacred Host immediately. It's **not** appropriate to walk back to your pew with the host in your hand. Let us be mindful that it is the Sacred Body, blood, soul and divinity of Jesus Christ that we are receiving.

If you are unable to receive Holy Communion during Mass, for whatever reason (i.e.: You are of another faith, you are married outside the church, you never made your First Holy Communion, have not gone to confession this past year or have serious sin on your soul), please feel free to come up on the communion line to receive a blessing. Just cross your hands over your heart and that will be the indication to the minister of Holy Communion to say a prayer over you. In that moment you can make a spiritual communion. That consists of consciously inviting Jesus into your heart in a deeper and fuller way. Surrender to him your hopes, dreams, successes, failures, fears, past, present and future. Invite him into your mind, heart, soul and body. Invite him into what you do with your leisure and finances and every choice you make. Tell Jesus, please be Lord of my entire life.

Eucharistic Procession

ALL are welcome to join Fr. Dennis and myself as we process around the church property with the Blessed Sacrament following the 12:30pm Mass. May we do this with joy in our hearts over the love God has for us. We will be stopping at three different locations on the property offering prayers and readings in honor of the Holy Eucharist. As we process with the Eucharist there will be a 9 foot canopy over it, accompanied by 6 tiki torches, 14 decorative umbrellas from India made for procession, our first communion children, the deacons, altar servers and more. There will also be recorded music for us to sing with while processing and honoring the Lord. The whole procession will be approximately 35 - 40 minutes but will conclude back in the church with benediction. For those who cannot walk in this beautiful procession, you are welcome to remain in the church for the final benediction.


Have a great week walking with your Lord and remember that with Him in you, you can do the unthinkable, unimaginable and even forgive the unforgivable.

June is the Month of the Most Sacred Heart of Jesus

Why is June the month of the Sacred Heart of Jesus?

June is known as the month of the Sacred Heart of Jesus most simply because the solemnity of the Sacred Heart is celebrated during this month. This year, the solemnity falls on June 7. The date changes each year because it is celebrated on the Friday after the Corpus Christi octave, or the Friday after the second Sunday after Pentecost. However, other reasons exist as to why June is dedicated to the Sacred Heart.

The feast dates back to 1673, when a French nun who belonged to the Order of the Visitation of Holy Mary (Visitandines) in eastern France began to receive visions of Jesus.

Jesus appeared to Sister Margaret Mary Alacoque and revealed ways to venerate his Sacred Heart and explained the immense love he has for humanity, appearing with his heart visible outside his chest, on fire, and surrounded by a crown of thorns.

These different ways include partaking in a holy hour on Thursdays and the reception of the Eucharist on the first Friday of every month.

Jesus told Sister Margaret Mary: "My Sacred Heart is so intense in its love for men, and for you in particular, that not being able to contain within it the flames of its ardent charity, they must be transmitted through all means."

These visions continued for 18 months.

On June 16, 1675, Jesus told Sister Margaret Mary to promote a feast that honored his Sacred Heart. He also gave her 12 promises made to all who venerate and promote the devotion of the Sacred Heart.

He said: "I ask of you that the Friday after the octave of Corpus Christi be set apart for a special feast to honor my heart, by communicating on that day, and making reparation to it by a solemn act, in order to make amends for the

indignities which it has received during the time it has been exposed on the altars. I promise you that my heart shall expand itself to shed in abundance the influence of its divine love upon those who shall thus honor it, and cause it to be honored."

Sister Margaret Mary died in 1690 and was canonized by Pope Benedict XV on May 13, 1920.

The Vatican was hesitant to declare a feast to the Sacred Heart, but as the devotion spread throughout France, the Vatican granted the feast of the Sacred Heart of Jesus to France in 1765.

In 1856, Pope Pius IX designated the Friday following the feast of Corpus Christi as the feast of the Sacred Heart for the universal Church. Ever since, the month of June has been devoted to the Sacred Heart of Jesus and his immense love for all of humanity.

On the current calendar, the feast of the Sacred Heart of Jesus is a solemnity, the highest-ranking feast in the liturgical calendar, although it is not a holy day of obligation.

I will give them all the graces necessary for their state of life.

I will give peace in their families.

I will console them in all their troubles.

I will be their refuge in life and especially in death.

I will abundantly bless all their undertakings.

Sinners shall find in my heart the source and infinite ocean of mercy.

Tepid souls shall become fervent.

Fervent souls shall rise speedily to great perfection.

I will bless those places wherein the image of my Sacred Heart shall be exposed and venerated.

I will give to priests the power to touch the most hardened hearts.

Persons who propagate this devotion shall have their names eternally written in my heart.

In the excess of the mercy of my heart, I promise you that my all-powerful love will grant to all those who will receive Communion on the first Fridays, for nine consecutive months, the grace of final repentance: They will not die in my displeasure, nor without receiving the sacraments; and my heart will be their secure refuge in that last hour.


Sacred Heart of Jesus, I place all my trust in you.


CHILDREN'S LITURGY OF THE WORD






Sharing the Gospel


