Iesus Christus resurrexit dixit, alleluia!

This Latin phrase, which means Jesus Christ has risen today, Alleluia, should be on our lips for the next 50 days of the Easter season. Why? For He truly has been raised from the dead and our lives must be changed forever.

Happy Easter to all parishioners and visitors! We have just journeyed through the 40 days of Lent, celebrated our Easter Triduum, and reached the point of the resurrected Christ. How joyful it is to know that our Lord was not simply a wise sage who traversed the earth 2000 years ago. He indeed is the Son of God with the power to transform us into a resurrected people.

We at Our Lady of Lourdes in West Islip have much to be thankful for. First, for you, our loyal parishioners and the many events that we sponsor here. I counted 15 different ministries in our bulletin that many of you attend and others can join (check it out in the bulletin).

We also have day long mini pilgrimages to area shrines. We just went to the Shrine of Saint Francis Xavier Cabrini in Manhattan with 165 pilgrims. In the Fall we will be going with about 100 pilgrims to Sight and Sound in Lancaster, Pennsylvania for a day long trip.

This summer we have two extended pilgrimages: one to Italy for the canonization of Blessed Pier Giorgio Frassati. We will also visit the incorrupt, mortal remains of recently canonized Saint Carlo Acutis (will be canonized April 27), the first millennial saint. Additionally, we are going on pilgrimage to Medjugorje to witness to the alleged apparitions of Our Lady, the Blessed Virgin Mary to visionaries.

In the Fall and the Spring, the parish sponsors bible studies on interesting topics of our faith with deep dives into scripture. This is a great way to immerse oneself into the mysteries of the bible and it's personal meaning for our lives.

If you are a young adult, between the ages of 21-39, we have a vibrant group called the Frassati Young Adult Group. It meets twice a month on Tuesdays for prayer and a social. It's a great way to meet others who are on the Catholic journey!

Please consider utilizing our many programs as advertised above. And remember to great people with "Happy Easter" for the next 50 days, for Jesus Christ is truly risen today, Alleluia!!!

Easter 2025

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Happy Easter to you and your families in this Jubilee Year of Hope!

Our celebration of Easter rekindles our hope each year.

The Tomb is empty! Jesus is Risen!

A wealthy man and a member of the Sanhedrin, St. Joseph of Arimathea is one of those Gospel characters with a very brief but very important role.

In John 19:38-42, we see that after Jesus' Crucifixion, Joseph of Arimathea asks Pilate for permission to take away Our Lord's Body. This was a bold and courageous act of faith from a man "seeking the Kingdom of God." (Mark 15:43)

Joseph and Nicodemus together place our Lord's Body reverently in linen cloths prepared with myrrh, aloes and spices: "Now in the place where he was crucified there was a garden a new tomb where no one had ever been laid. So because of the Jewish day of Preparation, as the tomb was close at hand, they laid Jesus there."

In his commentary on the Gospel of Matthew, Fr. Simeon Leiva-Merikakis gives tribute to Joseph of Arimathea. He writes: "And how can we fail to do homage to Joseph of Arimathea? In performing a very humane corporal work of mercy by seeking out and burying the corpse of his beloved Teacher, Joseph becomes for all time a living icon of the eternal Father himself, stooping with compassion to enfold within his throbbing breast the mangled body of his beloved, Son, whom he himself handed over to sinners out of love for mankind. At long last, the Son of God on earth has fallen into the hands, not of a sinner, but of a just and compassionate man! Joseph of Arimathea enacts the justice and love of God himself."¹

As we celebrate Easter Sunday, the Easter Octave, Divine Mercy Sunday and the Easter Season, let us remember and ask the intercession of the great Joseph of Arimathea who prepared the Tomb of Christ and the Body of Christ with such sensitive care and compassion, such faith, courage and reverence. The Tomb is Empty! He is Risen!

Alleluia! Alleluia!


"Why do you seek the living among the dead? He is not here, but has risen."

Easter is not simply one feast among others, but the "Feast of feasts," the "Solemnity of solemnities," just as the Eucharist is the "Sacrament of sacraments" (the Great Sacrament).

Easter Sunday is the greatest of all Sundays. The season of Easter is the most important of all liturgical times, when we Catholics celebrate the Lord's resurrection from the dead, culminating in his Ascension to the Father and on Pentecost, sending of the Holy Spirit upon the Church. The octave of Easter comprises the eight days which stretch from the first to the second Sunday. It is a way of prolonging the joy of the initial day. There are 50 days of Easter from the first Sunday to Pentecost. It is characterized, above all, by the joy of glorified life and the victory over death expressed most fully in the great resounding cry of the Christian: Alleluia! All faith flows from faith in the resurrection: "If Christ has not been raised, then empty is our preaching; empty, too, is your faith." (1 Cor 15:14)

"We bring you the good news that what God promised to the fathers, this day he has fulfilled to us their children by raising Jesus." The Resurrection of Jesus is the crowning truth of our faith in Christ, a faith believed and lived as the central truth by the first Christian community.

Christ is risen from the dead!





2025 is the Jubilee Holy Year, the 2,025th anniversary of the Incarnation of our Lord, an "event of great spiritual, ecclesial, and social significance in the life of the Church." The concept of "Jubilee" has its origins in the Book of Leviticus (Chapter 25) as a special year of reconciliation, pilgrimage, and coming home.

Pope Francis has designated the 2025 Holy Year as a time to renew ourselves as "Pilgrims of Hope."

The 2025 Jubilee is a year of hope, a theme reflected in the opening words of the Bull of Indiction*, entitled "Spes non confundit. Hope does not disappoint." "Everyone knows what it is to hope," the Pope wrote in the introduction to the Bull. "In the heart of each person, hope dwells as the desire and expectation of good things to come, despite our not knowing what the future will bring."

The 2025 Jubilee is centered on the theme "Pilgrims of Hope." As His Holiness Pope Francis so beautifully expressed it: "We must fan the flame of hope that has been given us, and help everyone to gain new strength and certainty by looking to the future with an open spirit, a trusting heart and far-sighted vision." During the Jubilee Year, the Pope invites every one of us to embark on a pilgrimage of hope, so that, "Through our witness, may hope spread to all those who anxiously seek it."

He is calling all Christians to "be passionate about life and commit ourselves to caring lovingly for those around us in every place where we live." When our families are fractured, when the news is depressing, when all prospects look bleak that is when we are asked to pay careful attention to hope, the fundamental virtue that informs who we are as Catholic Christians.

The message is clear, we are called to be "pilgrims of hope and builders of peace," basing our lives on Christ's resurrection. Reflecting on the gospel message is where we find the strength to be joyful in hope.

* Tradition dictates that each Jubilee is proclaimed through the publication of a Papal (or Pontifical) 'Bull of Indiction'. By 'Bull' is meant an official document, generally written in Latin, bearing the seal of the Pope, the shape of which gives its name to the document itself.



Divine Mercy Prayer Service / Indulgence / Confessions

Are you familiar with the Divine Mercy of Jesus? On February 22, 1931, Our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ appeared to a nun by the name of Sister Maria Faustina Kowalska. She was from the Congregation of Sisters of Our Lady of Mercy in Cracow, Poland. Jesus appeared to her bringing with him a wonderful message of Mercy for all people. In the apparition she saw Jesus standing before her in a white robe. With his left hand he was pulling back his garment revealing his heart, out of which came white and red rays (*symbolic of the blood and water which flowed from his side when pierced with a lance on the cross. This image reminds us of the tender Mercy of God which was shed upon the world at Calvary). This image of Jesus as he appeared to St. Faustina can be seen hanging on the back wall of the church behind the last pew. It is in the heart of Jesus that we find love, mercy, strength, hope and healing. Jesus said to St. Faustina, the greater the sinner, the greater their right to my mercy. No matter what sin one commits, if their heart is truly repentant, God will forgive them.*

In the year 2000 Saint Pope John Paul II canonized Sister Faustina a saint, making this apparition worthy of belief. The Holy Father also declared the Second Sunday of Easter as Divine Mercy Sunday throughout the whole Church. Jesus asked this of St. Faustina.



Therefore, as a parish we will be celebrating **Divine Mercy Sunday on April 27, 2025.** We will praise God for His eternal love and abundant mercy. How? There will be a

prayer service in the Church from 2:30 p.m.- 4:15 p.m. The prayer service will consist of exposition of the Blessed Sacrament, readings from scripture, praying the chaplet of Divine Mercy (*which consists of various prayers that Jesus gave to Sister Faustina to give to the world. This chaplet is prayed on ordinary rosary beads*), the sorrowful mystery of the rosary, singing and the opportunity to venerate the image of the Divine Mercy and the first-class relic of Saint Faustina. All are welcome to join us.

In the apparition of Jesus to St. Faustina He also gives us the Divine Mercy Novena to pray. The Novena begins on Good Friday and ends the day before Divine Mercy Sunday. The Novena is very unique because Jesus gives us the intentions that He wants us to pray for over the 9 days. It is a most beautiful and selfless prayer. There will be red Novena pamphlets at all the doors of the church in case you need one.

INDULGENCE & CONFESSION: Jesus tells us through St. Faustina that He will grant us a plenary indulgence on the Feast of Divine Mercy. What is a plenary indulgence? It is the total remission (*washing away*) of temporal punishment due to sin. When I go to confession and confess my sins with a sincere and contrite heart, I am forgiven. Yet, the temporal (*the here and now*) damage that was done to others (*and myself*) as a result of my sin remains. That's why we do penance to try to repair the damage we have done and allow God to transform our hearts. If we continue to commit the same sins, that is a clear indication that our hearts have not been transformed. If we do not do penance on earth, God in his mercy will allow us to do this in purgatory. Yet, God would much rather we go right to heaven. That's why a plenary indulgence is a huge merciful gift from the Lord. How can one receive it? Here are the requirements: One must go to mass and receive holy communion on the feast of Divine Mercy, April 26th \ 27th. One must go to confession within 10 days of the feast (*either before or after*), pray the Apostles creed (*which is your profession of faith*), take a few moments to reflect on the mercy you have received in your life, pray one Our Father and Hail Mary for the Pope's intention and lastly, have a desire to be freed from the attachment to sin.

Fr. Dennis will be hearing confession during the prayer service on Sunday, April 27 $^{\rm th}$ for your convenience.

Several years ago, Fr. Charles and his sister recorded a Divine Mercy Album which consists of the Divine Mercy Chaplet presented in three different ways: scriptural, traditional and sung. It also has the Litany of the Divine Mercy and several reflection songs. The purpose of the CD is to help you pray and reflect more deeply on the love of our Lord expressed in his passion. 
